Reporting to the Chair, School of Business Management, the Professor will be responsible for providing academic leadership and developing an effective learning environment for students through designing, revising and delivering curricula. The Professor will also be responsible for developing subject and program objectives, defining and evaluating learning outcomes and developing/selecting appropriate learning materials. The Professor will teach subjects in his/her areas of expertise, provide academic and career counseling to students, and evaluate student performance. The Professor will participate in curriculum development, program advisory and other committees through consultation with business and industry representatives.

The Professor will be responsible for teaching a variety of courses, which may include: Business Management, Decision Analysis, Foundations of Strategic Marketing & Planning, Eco-productivity and other subjects within the School of Business Management.

A relevant Masters degree in Business is required. A candidate who has, or is working toward, a Doctorate degree would be preferred. Strong working knowledge of sustainability is an asset. Two years teaching experience at the post secondary level and industry experience are required, along with progressively responsible experience demonstrating adult education principles in program planning, curriculum development, teaching adults and assessing community/business/industry needs. The incumbent must have the demonstrated ability to develop curriculum and incorporate technology into his/her teaching, including expertise using Microsoft Word, Excel and PowerPoint. Established relationships with key organizations in the sector throughout the GTA and York Region would be preferred.

Excellent communication and human relation skills are essential to interact effectively with the College's multi-cultural/racial/able student and staff population, as is an understanding of and commitment to education equity. The ability to convey the conceptual and practical aspects of curriculum to students, while respecting their diverse backgrounds, experience and individual learning styles is necessary. Must be able to work independently and with other faculty to develop and deliver curriculum and contribute positively to the team environment. Demonstrated leadership, computer and organizational skills, motivation and a willingness to innovate and apply new teaching techniques and technologies are also required. Applicants selected for an interview will be required to present a teaching lesson during the interview.
